

Program Notes from September 2

Bob Dascola introduced Ingrid Ault, Executive Director, Think Local First, who said TLF was open to independently owned businesses. “We are a movement,” she said, “which provides a collective voice for small businesses.” Its parent organization is BALLE – Business Alliance for Local Living Economies. With 200 members, TLF says that dollars spent locally stay and recirculate in the community; that way, one person has an impact and can make a difference. Ingrid said that when you spend \$100 in an independent store, \$68 stays and recirculates, whereas at a “big box” retailer, only \$43 stays in the community. Member benefits include a listing in the annual directory, educational and networking opportunities and exposure on Lucy Ann Lance’s Business Insider on WLBY, 1290 AM. Ingrid asked us to think carefully what “local” means and gave examples of truly local banks and bookstores. Seven reasons to think local first are (1) give great service (2) contribute to a community’s economic success (3) create community (4) offer unique goods and atmosphere (5) give back to community (6) improve local environment and (7) create great places to work. *Notes by Don Faber, Harpoon editor; photos by David Reid*
