<b>AE or A-E</b>	<b>Active-Exempt</b>	Upon request and the combination of 85 or more sum of age and years of service, a Rotarian is excused from attendance and participation requirements. This category is also known as R85. Financial obligations are unchanged.	John White
<b>AO or A-O</b>	<b>Active-Ordinary</b>	The category of membership for most Rotarians. See A-E or R85 for differences.	John White
<b>APF</b>	<b>Annual Programs Fund</b>	The fund at TRF that dispenses all the donations it receives, as opposed to the PF which only distributes a planned portion of the corpus	John White
<b>CAC</b>	<b>Community Allocations Committee</b>	The club committee that identifies the dozen or so charities to receive the funds from our CSA donations	Mary Avrakotos, Michael Field
<b>CSA</b>	<b>Community Service Assessment</b>	An annual required donation covering the upcoming calendar year. Billing is in the fall as part of the 1-2-3-4 invoice. The proceeds are distributed by the CAC to local charities in May or June	John White
<b>DG</b>	<b>District Governor</b>	The leader of all the clubs in a district. Our district is 6380 and covers 52 clubs in Washtenaw, Livingston and Oakland counties in MI and Kent county in Ontario	John White
<b>DGE</b>	<b>District Governor Elect</b>	The successor to the DGE	John White
<b>DGEN</b>	<b>District Governor Elect Nominee</b>	The proposed successor to the DGE. District leadership is planned well in advance to maximize continuity	John White

<b>GMM</b>	<b>General Membership Meeting</b>	Our weekly luncheon meeting (as abbreviated on our web calendar)	John White
<b>IHPC</b>	<b>International Humanitarian Projects Committee</b>	A club committee dedicated to creating, planning and overseeing international projects	Susan Froehlich
<b>Interact</b>	<b>A combination of "international" and "action"</b>	Interact is Rotary's arm for 12-18 year olds. Our club sponsors Interact at Pioneer and Huron High Schools.	Ed Wier
<b>LCC</b>	<b>Large Club Conference</b>	An annual meeting of representatives of the world's largest Rotary clubs. The PE and ES attend. The 2015 meeting will be Feb. 5-8 in San Antonio	John White
<b>MDC</b>	<b>Membership Development Committee</b>	The club committee that organizes and oversees the recruiting of new Rotarians	Collyer Smith

<b>PEN</b>	<b>President-Elect Nominee</b>	The proposed successor to the PE	John White
<b>PETS</b>	<b>President-Elect Training Seminar</b>	The mandatory 3-day training session for each club's PE. Usually held in March	John White
<b>PF</b>	<b>Permanent Fund</b>	Similar to our club's Permanent Endowment, this TRF account accepts donation to the corpus and distributes only a portion of the income from its investments. Donations to the PF count toward "Benefactor" status	John White
<b>PHF</b>	<b>Paul Harris Fellow</b>	An honor achieved initially by donating \$1000 to the APF (includes EREY and PP) of TRF	John White
<b>PP</b>	<b>Polio Plus</b>	A TRF program dedicated to the eradication of polio worldwide. The option to contribute appears on the 1-2-3-4 invoice in the fall. Donations count toward a PHF	John White
