**Bob Pratt's Tribute to Ken Westerman:** Here is the full text of Bob's remarks:

“It is an honor and pleasure to introduce my friend and colleague, Kenneth Westerman, to the Rotary Club of Ann Arbor's Distinguished Service Award on this, his 25<sup>th</sup> Winter Concert for us.

Ken comes from a musical family. His father was a voice teacher and author of a textbook on singing. His mother was a vocal music teacher at Slauson School. Ken is an Ann Arbor native and was raised on Granger Street, in the house where he still lives, just across the street from the late William D. Revelli, who was Ken's mentor.

I first met Ken when he sang in my choir at Pioneer High. He was also a member of the hockey team there, which won two state championships, plus the football and soccer teams; a three-letter man! When he graduated from Pioneer, he toured Europe with the Youth for Understanding Chorale. Then it was off to Yale University where he was a member of the Glee Club, the famous Whiffenpoofs and the Spizwinks. He has another degree from the University of Michigan School of Music. Ken's lovely wife, Cherry, also a Yale grad, is now the vocal music teacher at Slauson Middle School, a fine program and a great “farm team” for the Pioneer Choir.

They have two grown children who both sang under Ken at school; Erica, yet another Yale grad, working on her Ph.D. in Zoology at the University of New Hampshire, and Michael, who is a sophomore at Bowdoin College. They both sing at their respective schools.

Does Ken have a hobby? He sure does. He plays hockey twice a week!
