Topic: "A Tragic Toll on Children: AIDS Orphans In Rwanda"

There are 12 million African children who have been orphaned by AIDS, and that number is expected to reach 25 million by 2010. CHABHA works in four African countries, and in Rwanda, CHABHA works to support children who many times are now head of household, parenting their siblings. The focus of the presentation will be to educate us about the two programs focuses, the conditions and problems, as well as the reasons for hope, with regard to children in Rwanda who have been affected by HIV/AIDS and the 1994 genocide.



Rotarians in the News: In the September 15 issue of the Ann Arbor News, Tom Degrazia was noted for the Volunteer of the Month Award he received from the Ford Motor Company, primarily for his work with the American Red Cross Washtenaw County Chapter. The award was extra special in that he is a Ford retiree. Congratulations, Tom!

Rotarian Magazine for September: September is “New Generations” month. Two articles, “Building our Future” and “In with the New,” discuss recruiting younger members and seeking alumni of Rotary’s youth programs, such as Rotaract, Interact, RYLA and Rotary Youth Exchange. The first article includes details on the distribution of age groups of Rotarians worldwide. Here is how club compares with averages throughout Rotary: Under 40 = 11% (our club = 5%); 40-49 = 21% (12%); 50-59 = 29% (17%); 60-69 = 22% (32%) and 70+ = 17% (34%). Although we are clearly on the high side in chronological age, it should be noted that one quarter of our members have been in the club fewer than three years and that ten is the median for years of service.
