

# Notes from the Program from September 5, 2007

Scott Westerman, former superintendent of schools for the Ann Arbor School District, introduced the current superintendent (and fellow Rotarian) Todd Roberts, speaking on "Challenges and Opportunities facing Ann Arbor

Public Schools." Todd praised the work of the Ann Arbor Public Schools Educational Foundation in aiding the school district during tough times. The district receives 90 percent of its funding from the state, and Michigan is looking at a \$1.6-2 billion deficit for fiscal year 2008; another \$800 million deficit looms in the school aid fund. Local revenues of the school district are \$182 million, with expenditures totaling \$188 million.

Todd said "we've reduced costs by eliminating positions, privatizing the food service, consolidating services in the county and reducing property and liability insurance." He said the district has a strategic plan to possibly put in place if budget cuts increase. So even though the short-term outlook isn't so good, Todd Roberts is "very optimistic about the future of the school district. If good things can't happen here, they can't happen anywhere."

And still on that optimistic note, he said the district's rigorous academic emphasis has paid off in the number of Merit Scholarships Ann Arbor gets. "We have a variety of educational programs, an exemplary arts and music education program and we've made progress in closing the achievement gap in math and reading," he said.

We might add that Todd has a real stake in Ann Arbor, with children attending local schools and another youngster on the way.

President Al's "Thought for the Day" comes to us from educator Derek Bok: If you think education is expensive, try ignorance.

**A Note about RYLA:** The following article was excerpted from a message from Merle Loch, our district's Rotary Information Officer, as part of the celebration of September as "New Generations Month."

Let's examine RYLA. Just what is this? It stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. How did it begin? In 1959, Rotarians from Queensland, Australia selected outstanding young people from their communities to attend a weeklong conference hosted by the Rotary Club of Brisbane. The teenagers participated in an agenda filled with social, cultural and educational activities. The club was so impressed with the students and the students were so enthusiastic in their praise of how it had helped them with their personal growth that soon other clubs in Australia heard about this RYLA and began similar programs.

And so RYLA spread across the Rotary world and in 1971, the RI Board of Directors adopted RYLA as a Rotary Youth Program. Today teenagers in many countries attend RYLA conferences to learn about leadership, decision making, goal setting, good citizenship, conflict resolution and other life skills taught to them by accomplished business, community and political leaders.

In addition, each year now, Rotary clubs and districts nominate local RYLA alumni to attend the International RYLA held in conjunction with the Rotary International Convention. In June, in Salt Lake City, several hundred participants from 25 countries were present. Many of whom report that they are going home to join a Rotary Club and continue service projects in their own communities, country and the world.

Here in District 6380, the RYLA's are being held each year at Ridgetown College in Ridgetown, Ontario. Students (grades 9-11) from both sides of the border have been attending these sessions since 1987. They spend a week-end living in the college dormitories. Every year the raves and reviews are outstanding!

The next RYLA will be held in May 2008. Rotarians are encouraged to volunteer as counselors. Perhaps YOU would like to have an outstanding Rotary experience? Try it--You'll like it!
