

Notes from the Meeting of March 5, 2008



James Stanley

Fritz Seyferth introduced Dr. James C. Stanley, director of the U-M Cardiovascular Center on the topic "The Michigan Experience in Vascular Medicine and Surgery." The CVC is a team of cardiologists, neurologist, vascular surgeons, etc. whose mission is excellence in education, compassionate care and innovative science. More than 200 physicians and 900 staff make up the CVC. Dr. Stanley illustrated blockage of the vital carotid artery and ruptured aortas; blockage in the former causes strokes. Carotid artery disease is a "major cause of severe disabilities," said Dr. Stanley, and the third most common cause of death in the U.S. His advice: Get a carotid scan. To help prevent aortic aneurysms, Dr. Stanley called for early diagnosis and imaging via ultrasound.

President Al's Thought for the Day: "So many people spend their health gaining wealth...and then have to spend their wealth to regain their health." This is from Dr. Paul Dudley White.

Rotaract Reaches Middle-age: The first Rotaract club was formed in North Carolina on March 13, 1968 as a logical next step for young people no longer of Interact age (14-18). The name Rotaract (Rotary in Action) was selected to show the program's close affiliation with both Rotary and Interact clubs. Originally, Rotaract clubs were open to young men and women ages 17-24.
